# Return To Middle School Lesson Plans

Title: What Is Mining Level: Middle School Time: 90 minutes KERA Goals: 2.1

#### **Objective:**

The student will develop a vocabulary of "mining words" and learn about exploring and mining for minerals.

#### Materials:

plastic swimming pool or equivalent soil rocks of various sizes iron filings small shovels screens magnets

Activity: Mining for Coal

- 1. Before class, mix the soil, rocks and iron filings together in the plastic swimming pool. This will represent our "mine."
- 2. Introduce the class to the words: coal, mine, mineral, rock, waste, prospecting, and exploration. Explain the definition of each word and what type of an activity it represents.
- Have the class break into groups; assign each group an area at the "mine" to do their "exploration" for the valuable "coal." The coal is represented by the rocks and iron filings.
- 4. Have the groups use shovels to dig up the area that they think contains "coal" and have them save the material.
- 5. Then using the screens, have them separate the rocks from the soil.
- 6. Then using the magnets, have them separate the iron filings from the soil and the rocks.
- 7. The rocks and the iron filings represent valuable "coal" and the soil that is left is the "waste."

# **Teacher Hint:**

Use different colored rocks and have the students mine for one special color.

Not all groups may find "coal" when mining. This can be used to help explain why it is very difficult to find a coal deposit and why mines are located where they are.
